- Genesis 22:14
  - Jehovah is close to Yahweh "the existing one"
    - Derives from "hava" to be or to exist
  - o Jireh means provide
  - The lord will provide a way when he asks you to do something.
  - $\circ$  So be obedient
    - What has God asked you to do?
      - Are you listening maybe God has laid something on your heart. Have you said Here I am?
      - Start a bible study
      - Be a part of a study
      - Be in the Word every day
      - Commit to a certain time in prayer.
    - Are you allowing God to provide
    - Will you listen for God
    - The world is fighting for your attention in so many different ways.
    - There are many things competing to be the God of your life
      - Sports tell you, you must be a certain weight and be able to do certain things and so you work to obtain those goals
      - School tells you, you must have a certain GPA to be successful, so you study
      - Work tells you, you must have so much money in order to make it and have things that you need
