Pick two of these topics and discuss both sets of questions after reading the verses.

School/Grades: Slaving Away in Egypt (Exodus 5:1-21)

- 1. What do you like the most about school? What do you dislike the most?
- 2. What keeps you from getting better grades?
- 3. Are the expectations of your parents generally too high, reasonable or too low?
- 4. Concerning schoolwork, whose expectations cause you the most stress: You? Your teachers? Your parents? Others?
- 5. What about the expectations you have for yourself, are you too hard or too easy on yourself?
- 6. What expectations do you think God has for you?
- 7. In the past week in your spiritual life, are you encouraged or discouraged? Is there any connection between that and your schoolwork? Why or why not?

School/Grades: Trials and Temptations (James 1:2-18)

- 1. What's your GPA? Or how are your grades right now?
- 2. How satisfied are you with your grades? How satisfied are your parents?
- 3. What's your usual approach to a test: Fear? Joy? Prayer? Study all night? Others?
- 4. Why is perseverance important (see v. 4)? What reward comes with persevering in the faith?
- 5. On a scale of 1 (not very) to 10 (very), how serious are you about your schoolwork? Explain your answer.
- 6. When have you been tempted to cheat on a test or assignment? What your response to temptation?
- 7. If God were handing out crowns today according to how well you have persevered over this past school year, do you think you'd get one? Why?
- 8. Where do you need wisdom? Pray and ask God for it.

Decisions: God's Wisdom (1 Corinthians 1:18-25)

- 1. When you were a little kid what did you want to be? What do you want to be now?
- 2. What do you want to be doing 10 years from now? What will it take to get there?
- 3. What do you feel are the most important decisions you will make in your life?
- 4. How much influence does your commitment to Christ have in choosing your career?
- 5. What's one of the best decisions you've made? What's one of the worst?
- 6. Looking back on the last big decision you made, did you listen more to the world's wisdom or God's?
- 7. How does your schoolwork and education tie together with making good decisions?
- 8. Christ was "a stumbling block" and "foolishness" to some. What decision have you made about following Christ?
- 9. How can the group pray for you in making wise, Christ-centered decisions?

Success/Ambition: James & John Make a Request (Mark 10:35-45)

- 1. Who is the most competitive person in your family? Do you see competitiveness as a positive or negative quality?
- 2. Who do you know that is a "great" person? What is it that makes them great?
- 3. What would you need to accomplish in your life to consider yourself a success?
- 4. How is Christ's teaching about how to be great (v. 43) different from what others teach?
- 5. Who do you compare yourself against to see if you measure up?
- 6. What could you do this week at home that would live out your commitment to Christ to be a servant to others? What about at school?

Success/Ambition: Nothing Compares to Knowing Christ (Philippians 3:1-11)

- 1. What person in your school would you vote "most likely to succeed"? Why? What have they got going for them?
- 2. Would your parents say you have too much ambition or too little? Why?
- 3. What is it going to take for you to be a success in the eyes of your parents? Your friends? God's?
- 4. According to Paul, what's the secret to success (v. 8)?
- 5. Paul desires to know Christ better (v. 10). On a scale of 1 (none) to 10 (great), how does your desire in this area rank?
- 6. What "rubbish" do you need to give up to know Christ better?
- 7. How would you compare your life goals to the apostle Paul's goals in this passage?
- 8. What role does getting good grades and giving your very best in your schoolwork play in accomplishing these life goals?

Setting Priorities: Counting the Cost (Luke 14:25-35)

- 1. In a "high-stakes" game, are you more likely to play it safe or gamble everything on the next play?
- 2. When was the last time you went to buy something and found you didn't have enough money? How did you feel? What did you do?
- 3. What are your top three priorities in life right now? School? Work? Family? Friends? Dating? Church? Other? What should be your top three priorities right now?
- 4. Why would Jesus tell us to hate our own families?
- 5. Do you tend to give Jesus pieces of yourself (certain moments, some lifestyle choices, etc.) or give him your whole self? Which is better and why?
- 6. When did you first realize that following Jesus was costly? What price have you had to pay?
- 7. On a scale of 1 to 10, how heavy has your "cross" been this past school year 1 ("I can barely lift it") to 10 ("Jesus is carrying it for me")?
- 8. How can this group pray for you and help you to "carry your cross"?

Future Plans: Parable of the Rich Fool (Luke 12:13-21)

- 1. If you could have fame, fortune or good looks, which would you choose?
- 2. How important is it to have money at your school? Fame? Good looks? What other qualities are important?
- 3. What would you like to be doing 10 years from now? Where would you like to be living?
- 4. What was Jesus warning us against when he said, "watch out!" in verse 15?
- 5. "Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry" (v. 19). What is your attitude towards this philosophy? The attitude of those in your school?
- 6. In your plans for the future, on a scale of 1 (irrelevant) to 10 (essential), how important is making a lot of money?
- 7. How can you be "rich toward God" (v. 21)? How can you show this to others in your school?

Future Plans: Boasting About Tomorrow (James 4:13-17)

- 1. What are your plans for this weekend?
- 2. How do you go about deciding what to do for the weekend?
- 3. How far into the future have you planned for your life?
- 4. What attitude should you have towards planning (v. 15)?
- 5. Who do you admire for the way they live one day at a time making every day count for God? Why?
- 6. On a scale from 1 (little) to 10 (much), how much influence does your commitment to Christ affect your life goals?
- 7. Where do you need God's guidance in your plans for the future?
- 8. How can the group pray for you and support you?

Choosing A Career: Living Sacrifices (Romans 12:1-8)

- 1. What is your best subject in school?
- 2. What is the most memorable Christmas present you received as a child?
- 3. In your school, who do you admire because they march to a different drum?
- 4. How can you offer your "body" as a living sacrifice?
- 5. Of the gifts listed in verses 6-8, which one is most evident in your life? How will that affect your choice of a career? How will that affect the choices you make now in school?
- 6. How do you use your gifts within the church (Christ's body)? What holds you back from using your gifts more fully?
- 7. This past school year, did you feel more "conformed" or "transformed" (v. 2)? Why?
- 8. If you knew you could not fail, what goal or dream would you like to set for next school year?
